The Centre is situated on the stunning West coast of Wales and host an abundance of wildlife and natural beauty. To the West of the Centre is the stunning Preseli Mountains and to the East is the breath taking coast line which plays host to the migrating families of Bottlenose Dolphins. Grey Seals can also be found just off the rocky coast line. Not only is this shore rich in history but is home to many rare species of birds.
